

1. GCSE 2017 Cornwall Schools' Summary

All data is taken from 2017 validated performance tables

A	School	Name of school. The main list includes all Cornwall's secondary schools plus selected Devon schools. There are 31 secondary schools in Cornwall.
B	Headteacher/Principal	Current Headteachers (maintained schools) and Principals (academies) . 11 new HTs in the last 2 years and 4 last year.
C	Ofsted	Current grade and date of report. Note – two schools graded as inadequate last term.
D	Nor 11-16	Numbers of 11-16 students on roll.
E	M/A	School status - m aintained school (M) or a cademy (A)
F	P8 2016 Key performance indicator	National Progress 8 score for 2016. This is the first year P8 scores for all schools were published.
G	Grade 16	WAA well above average, AA above average, A average, BA below average, WBA well below average
H	Rank 16	P8 2016 rank 1-30 in Cornwall 2016 with 1 being highest. Data for Callington missing.
I	KS2 2016	Key stage 2 average points scores for 2016. This indicates ability of cohort and is used by DfE to group similar schools.
J	Rank KS2 16	Rank for KS2 APS from 1 highest (most able cohort) to 31 lowest (least able)
K	P8 2017 Key performance indicator	National Progress 8 score for 2017. This is the second year and the first reflecting number grades for EM.
L	P8 Rk 17	P8 2017 rank 1-31 in Cornwall 2017 with 1 being highest.
M	Grade 17	WAA well above average, AA above average, A average, BA below average, WBA well below average
N	SS/55/17	Similar schools – rank position out of 55 similar schools nationally for 2017 based on ability of cohort
O	KS2 17	Key stage 2 average points scores for 2017
P	Rank KS2 17	Rank for KS2 APS from 1 highest (most able cohort) to 31 lowest (least able)
Q	A8	Attainment 8. This is the average score achieved by students. Good for schools with more able intakes.
R	Rank A8	Rank 1-31 in Cornwall 2017 with 1 being the highest There are 31 secondary schools.
S	EM5+	Percentage students achieving English and maths at the higher grades at 5 – 9. Level 5 is the DfE's 'strong pass' for performance tables.
T	Rank EM5+	Rank 1-30 in Cornwall 2017 with 1 being highest . The Roseland comes top 50% (very able cohort!) and Treviglas bottom with 23%.
U	Ebacc 5+	Proportion of cohort achieving 5-9 in EBacc subjects. This needs to be compared to EBacc entry column P – there is a huge difference in entry rates .

V	Rank EB5+	Rank 1-30 in Cornwall 2017 with 1 being the highest. Launceston tops the table but they enter 71% of the cohort.
W	EBacc ent	Proportion of the year group entered for EBacc subjects. The government wants 75% and eventually 90% by 2022
X	Rank EB entries	EBacc entries by rank score. DfE target 75% by 2020
Y	EM4+	Percentage of students achieving 4+ in English and maths (standard pass)
Z	RankEM4+	Rank 1-30 in Cornwall 2017 with 1 being highest> The Roseland comes top 79% and Bodmin bottom with 42%.
AA	EB4+	Percentage of students achieving 4+ across EBacc subjects.
AB	Rank EB4+	Rank 1-30 in Cornwall 2017 with 1 being the highest. Launceston tops the table but they enter 71% of the cohort.
AC	Disadvantaged P8	Progress 8 score for SJS disadvantaged students – Ever 6 + LAC + adopted
AD	Rank DisP8	Progress 8 rank score for disadvantaged students from 1 (highest) to 31 (lowest)
AE	LPA	Progress 8 score for low prior attaining pupils based on KS2 scores. Weaker students make less progress relative to MPA and HPA students.
Af	MPA	Progress 8 score for middle attaining pupils based on KS2 scores.
AG	HPA	Progress 8 scores based on high attaining pupils based on KS2 scores. More able make more progress so higher P8 are expected.
AH	Entries	Exam entries - the average number of approved GCSE entries per student. Schools with low average entries may struggle to achieve good P8 scores.
